1. Approve or Amend Agenda

Planner Nash: Reviewed petition from property owner Joseph Cotter to the City to combine lots and vacate easement at 7757 and 7747 Prairie Grass Pass. CSTS will continue to collect fees for both lots. Property Owner was not available to attend.

2) Streetlight Request- Meadowview & CR68 (CK)

Mayor Kostik reviewed the request for a streetlight at the intersection of CR68 and Meadow View Blvd. A Scott County Intersection Street Light Policy Document reviewed for requirements and County does not see that a streetlight is warranted for this intersection.

Resident Bryant spoke regarding the benefit of a brighter streetlight for the intersection as currently only a decorative light is in place.

Mayor Kostik estimated cost for a new light from MVEC would be approx. \$2,000 plus maintenance.

- Council member comments included:
- Need for obtaining a formal estimate.
- Need to be aware of the other properties nearby and lighting
- Would granting this request also increase other neighborhoods also request lighting.
- Are there other options such as reflective signs, using the existing pole?

Engineer Nelson will do a quick review and mentioned an option to consider striping road with reflectivity on Meadow View Blvd.

Council questioned who currently pays for the corner light and if they may be willing to pay the monthly fee.

3) Credit River Entrance Signs (CK, LS)

Mayor Kostik advised quotes received from Safety Signs for new Credit River signs. Currently county roads do not have Credit River Road Signs County Roads 27, 21, 8, 44 possibly 68. — 8 Credit River signs at \$6,600. \$15,000 in budget currently. Several other signs in need of repairs which were also quoted. Permission from the County would be needed prior to sign installation.

4) SJPA (CK, BL)

Scott County Joint Prosecution Agreement (SJPA) discussed by Council Member Lawrence. City asked to join and Cost Share.
